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Learning Objectives:

At the conclusion of this activity, the participant will:

1. reflect on the experiences of colleagues who have participated in IMQ reaccreditation surveys since January 2009 and express an intent to change.
2. incorporate the new CLC standard and move toward “meaningful use” of CLC in RSS.

Performance-in-Practice Objective:

Participants will create a list of talking-points, highlighting pearls from colleagues who have recently undergone IMQ surveys. A SCMEC representative will conduct a 2 month follow-up asking if participants have shared their talking points with staff and/or colleagues, and with their CME committees.

Target Audience: Physicians and hospital personnel from the Medical Staff Office, CME Office, Medical Library, and/or Quality/PI Office, who are directly or indirectly involved in the CME Process.

Methods of Instruction: This will be taught as a workshop using roundtable discussion, examples, participant interaction.

Evaluation: Each attendee will receive an evaluation form to complete at the end of the meeting.
